

**The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, Communication Department** – A tenure-track assistant professor to teach a variety of undergraduate courses, primarily in public relations, conduct research, engage in professional service, and advise students. Twelve hours of teaching or the equivalent a semester. The person in this position will teach courses in public relations and help develop graduate-level courses in communication. Certification in public relations (APR) is desired. Candidates should possess a doctoral degree in mass communication or a related field and have significant professional experience. Start date August 2013. The communication department has 350 enrolled majors and seven full-time faculty members engaged in a variety of research. The department is one of just 109 programs in journalism and mass communication accredited by ACEJMC. The department has excellent relationships with the regional media and communication professions community.

The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga is an urban university of more than 10,000 students. The 100-acre campus is located near downtown Chattanooga, a metropolitan area of over 450,000 people.
