Current and Future Uses Update

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UT Board Approved Fee Language

- Approved in June 2013
- Assessments began in the Fall 2013 semester
- The Board definition for the fee states:
 - The Online Access Fee will generate a portion of the funds necessary to provide administrative, operational, technical, and maintenance support for the University's growing online platform.



Preferred Expenditures

- Online instruction salaries and operations
- Faculty training and professional development to enhance online instruction
- Course redesign for existing and new online course incentive payments
- Accreditation expenses
- Walker Teaching & Learning Center salaries and operations
- Lecture capture and retrofitting of classrooms for lecture capture



Preferred Expenditures

- Online program administrator salaries and operations
- Learning Management System (LMS) and online scholarly databases
- Information Technology (IT) salaries and operations supporting the online platform
- Internet bandwidth and network upgrades required to support or enhance the online platform
- Marketing and advertising funds for online pgrms.



Preferred Expenditures

- If colleges and departments are facing challenges spending funds, please contact the Budget & Finance Office for assistance.
- Any deviation from the preferred expenditures for the Online Access Fee funds should be approved jointly by the Provost and the Executive Vice Chancellor for Finance and Operations.



E&G Expenditure Swaps

- Colleges and units should review current E&G expenditures
- If E&G expenditures exist that are more appropriate for online and fall within the current preferred expenditure categories, they can possibly be swapped
- College and unit budget officers should work with the Budget & Finance Office to identify these expenditures and initiate the swaps
