Applicants must submit application materials through the Communication Sciences and Disorders Centralized Application Service (CSDCAS). Admission to the Master of Arts program in SLP only occurs once per calendar year. The deadline for all verified application materials is February 1 each year for that year's admissions class	There is no minimum grade point average required for applicants. Completion of the GRE is required but there is no minimum requirement. If the GRE is taken more than once the highest set of scores is considered. The Competitive GRE scores for students most recently accepted in the program were 306 (verbal: 155, quantitative: 151, writing: 4) and the Competitive GPA score (all four years of the undergraduate degree) was 3.77
