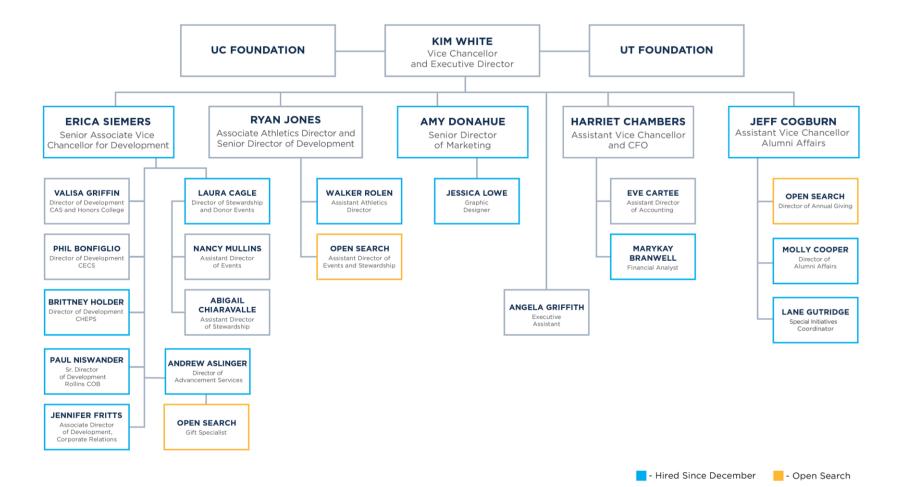
Mission Statement

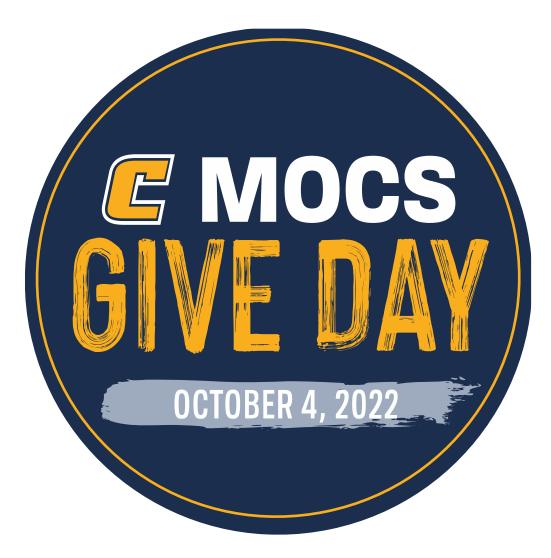

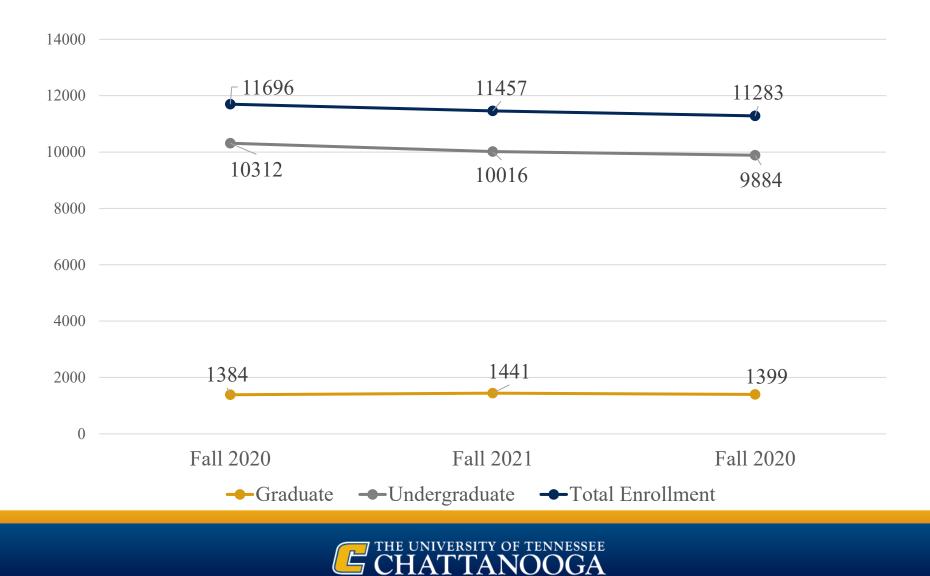

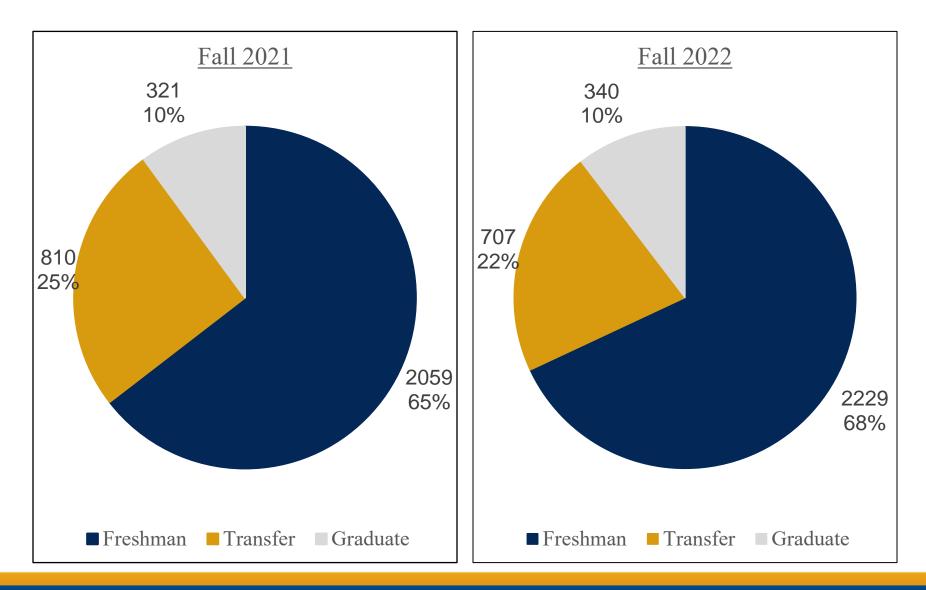

Enrollment (Fall 2020-Fall 2022)



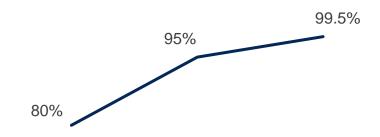

Financial Challenges and Opportunities

- Enrollment fluctuations
 - Non-Recurring budget reductions ~ \$3M
 - HEERF funding utilization ~ \$2.1M
 - Investment in marketing and recruitment
- Focus on student affordability (flat tuition)
- Inflation costs/Interest rates
- Compensation adjustments (min wage; compression)
- Quality Enhancement Plan (SACSCOC Accreditation)



FY 2022 Year End Review



Year End Highlights

- University maintained positive fiscal health
- Fund balances increased and remain healthy
 - E&G = 4.59% (THEC range 2-5%)
 - Auxiliary = 4.61% (THEC range 3-5%)
- Auxiliary units financially stable
- HEERF funding utilization and planning
- Divisions finished with surplus (\$7.5M)



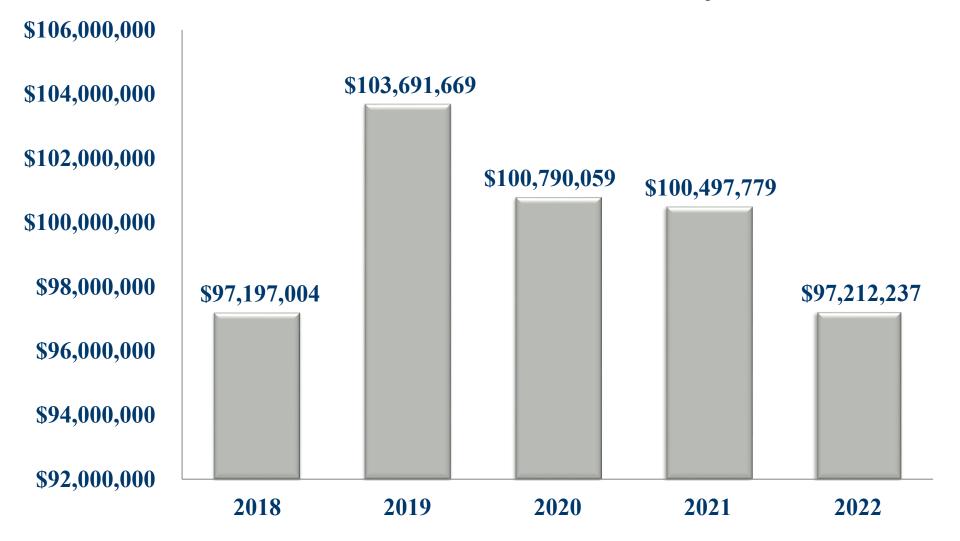

FY 18-22 Notes & Bonds Payable



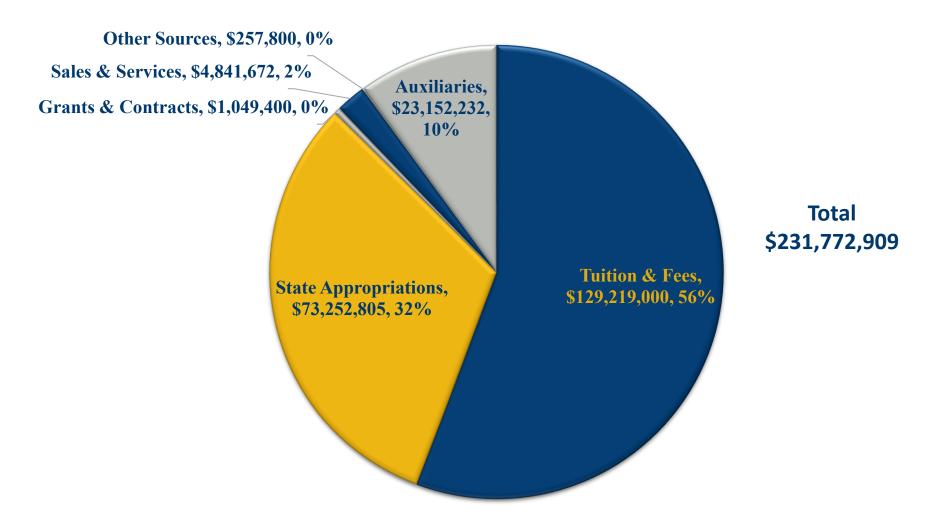

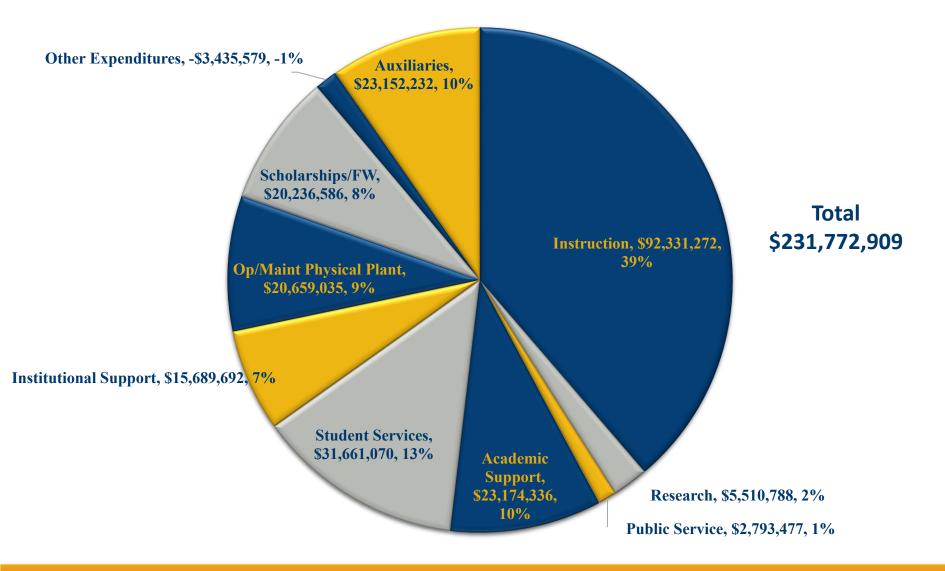


FY 23 E&G & Aux. Proposed Budget - Revenue
