* PHYS 1030/1030L features concepts in trigonometry, you must either take a math course that covers trig (MATH 1730) or enroll in BOTH MATH 1830 and MATH 1799 students should consult with their major advisor as to what math course is appropriate for their major
** For students required to take MATH 1950 only, MATH 1950 is not required or recommended for pharmacy school
*** Some programs may require upper level or science major microbiology, while others may just require microbiology for allied health careers or microbiology with a lab. Students should confirm with their programs of interest on the specific microbiology course needed.
**** Not all pharmacy programs require THSP 1090, or additional social science, or additional written/oral communication courses. Students should confirm requirements with programs of interest
